PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Litter at Bawdsey Quay: The council would like to thank villagers who are picking up and bagging litter at Bawdsey Quay. The hot weather has meant that more visitors are parking along the river front, including camper vans, and litter is overflowing the bins. The council has contacted Suffolk Norse to ask for an additional bin collection during the summer holidays. It has also asked that notices be put on the black bins asking visitors to put excess litter in the green bins on the Quay. If anyone would like to be part of a formal litter picking team, please contact the Clerk.

Hedges: Home owners are asked to trim back their hedges, especially those whose gardens front The Street or Ferry Road. It has been reported to the council that in some cases overgrown hedges are forcing motorists to move into the middle of the road, causing a potential traffic hazard.

New Councillor: At July's PC meeting, Emma Aldous was co-opted on to the parish council. Her details are on the website and the PC notice board.

Defibrillator: Use of the defibrillator outside the village hall is open to everyone in an emergency situation. In an emergency, dial 999 and begin using the equipment which talks you through the resuscitation process. The ambulance service contacts the First Responder in the area. A training course will take place in the autumn.

Speedwatch: The police have now approved a site outside the Village Hall for the Speedwatch team to operate from. Once volunteers have been trained, they should be operating Speedwatch from August.

Local Plan: The first draft of the Local Plan has been published and consultation on it runs from Friday 20 July, to 5.00pm on Friday 14 September 2018. A drop in session to review the plans is taking place on Monday 6th August from 4.00-7.30pm at SCDC offices, East Suffolk House, Riduna Park, Melton. Alternatively copies of the document are available at local libraries (including mobile libraries) across the district.

The Suffolk Coastal Local Plan is a framework document which will outline how the council sees the district developing over the next couple of decades. It covers the period to 2036 and contains the suggested planning policies, which will be used to determine planning applications in the area in the future. It also sets out the level of growth which needs to be planned for and identifies where that growth could be located and how it should be delivered. The Parish Council will respond as a body but individuals are also encouraged to respond.

PENINSULA VILLAGES COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

Inaugural meeting of Peninsula Villages CLT

On 3 July vast numbers of people were glued to their televisions watching the England team creating footballing history. Meanwhile in Hollesley Village Hall, speakers on behalf of the Peninsula Villages CLT and an audience of around sixty people were together creating an historic event of a different kind - but perhaps a very important one for all of us who live in villages on the peninsula.

Chaired by Anna Hardwick assisted by PVCLT trustees and guest speaker Debbie Wildridge, the meeting opened with a clear overview of the structure and purpose of a Community Land Trust. The audience had a chance to ask questions and make comments about this new and exciting venture.

The knowledge and commitment of the speakers, who dealt with practical matters such as the setting up, governance, policies, and the financial basis for offering genuinely affordable housing in our very expensive part of the world, was clearly appreciated by the audience. A measure of their success in reaching their audience was most signed up to become voting members through the payment of a pound membership at the end of the evening.

In years to come there could be many people, young and old, who will have the chance of somewhere to live in our villages thanks to this initiative. It offers a great chance for people not to be priced out of the area.

SUFFOLK FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE ADVICE

The public are urged to be aware of the potential risks posed by fire during a dry spell, especially when using barbecues or disposing of smoking materials. In 2011 fire crews attended 255 incidents in the county between 1 April and 1 July including a large number of heath land and countryside fires. Fires in the countryside can easily be started accidentally, or even deliberately. A carelessly discarded cigarette can lead to a huge fire, where the results to the wildlife can be devastating. Please follow these basic guidelines to keep Suffolk free from fire:

Basic Guidelines Do not discard cigarettes in the countryside

Do not leave glass items around after a picnic or barbecue

Put all litter in the bin

Do not light barbecues or fires

If you see a fire in the countryside, report it immediately

Don't attempt to tackle fires that can't be put out with a bucket of water – leave the area as quickly as possible

Barbecues Site barbecues well away from anything flammable, such as sheds/fences/shrubs

Never build fires in fields or forests

Position the barbecue on a firm, level base and shelter it from gusts of wind

Keep at least one bucket of water handy – just in case

Use recommended fluids or fire lighters when starting a barbecue

Never use any flammable liquid such as petrol to start or revive a bonfire/barbecue

If things go wrong, dial 999 immediately
