SET SAIL FOR AN ISLAND ADVENTURE THIS SUMMER

Nature lovers young and old can discover more about Suffolk's only island this summer with the RSPB's annual Havergate Adventure event, being held from 10-12 August 2019. Run by the RSPB Woodbridge Local Group, the Havergate Adventure offers an amazing opportunity for people to come and explore Havergate Island, its lagoons and salt marshes and encounter some of the wildlife that calls it home.

Now in its 31st year, the Adventure starts with an exhilarating 20-minute boat journey from Orford Quay to the Island. Once ashore, visitors explore the Island alongside a RSPB volunteer guide who will be on hand to help them spot some of the birds, animals and insects living on Havergate including the Avocet – best known as the bird featured in the RSPB logo.

To make sure visitors don't miss any of the Island's hidden treasures, binoculars are available for free on the day. At the end of the Adventure, visitors can buy homemade cakes, snacks and refreshments to enjoy along with a well-earned sit down, before heading back over the water to Orford.
