ST MARY'S CHURCH NOTES

Flower Festival This year's Flower Festival will be held on 4/5 July – later than usual. The theme is "Memories of the Sea" which can be widely interpreted and provide scope for not only a magnificent display of flowers but also lots of exciting props and ideas for decoration on window sills, tables, altar rails, etc. Bawdsey School will decorate the font as usual, and all parishioners are very welcome to add to the display. Refreshments are available in the tent and there will be a stall for plants, veg and flowers, etc. Contributions of such most welcome. Donations will be for the Church upkeep. National Churchyard Week runs from 6-14 June. Churchyards can be havens for wildlife, that has seen many changes over the past 60 years. They are rare remnants of an untouched grassland habitat that once was common throughout Suffolk. The varying lengths of grass, the headstones, pathways, mature trees and shrubs as well as the outside of the church building itself, all provide vital habitat for nesting, feeding and breeding refuge for a wide range of species. The Suffolk Wildlife Trust surveyed over 60 botanical specimens alone in St Mary's, and we have fine specimens of mature and veteran trees. Management of this valued habitat is quite a task and may involve cutting some areas of grass less frequently to allow wild flowers to thrive or allowing scrub to develop to benefit birds and insects. A prime example of this policy can be viewed in the form of the Ox-eye Daisies – clouds of which appear in the month of June in Bawdsey's churchyard.
