PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

HR Wallingford Report: This report, commissioned by the Crown Estate, on the extent and causes of coastal erosion at Bawdsey is on the website. Entitled Bawdsey Coastal Process Assessment, follow the link www.thecrownestate.co.uk/media/883246/Bawdsey-coastal-process-assessment.pdf

Bawdsey Quay Amenity Site: Talks with SCDC are taking place and any update on the situation of the BQVC project will be given in December's Bulletin.

Creating an East Suffolk Council: Suffolk Coastal and Waveney District Councils are considering a merger to create a new council to serve its residents and communities. A summary proposal has been published, explaining the proposal and the process www.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/new-single-council. A council decision will be made by January and the Secretary of State will decide in September 2017.

There are walks at every level in the Woodbridge area. These are short, free walks which take between 30-90 minutes.

Telephone Scam: One way of avoiding cold calls is to register with the Telephone Preference Service (TPS). However, some criminals are using this to defraud unsuspecting people. People have been contacted by telephone by those purporting to be from the TPS. They either attempt to get you to 'sign up' to the service, for which you will be told there is a charge or that your TPS agreement is about to expire and needs renewing. Both require your personal details and credit card details to be provided. BEWARE - THIS IS A SCAM! The TPS is a FREE service and anyone wishing to register can find more details on their website www.tpsonline.org.uk. If you suspect you have been contacted by a fraudulent organisation report it to ActionFraud at <http://www.actionfraud.police.uk>.

ROY CLARK – COASTGUARD LONG SERVICE AWARD

In 1949 Roy joined the Shingle Street Coastguard, known as "the Pirates" at HQ. Under the command of the late Eric Andrews, Shingle Street was renowned for its colourful characters and antics, and Roy is certainly one of those, with his sense of humour and uncontrollable giggles when things go wrong.

Soon after joining Roy was involved in the rescue of four German crew members off the coaster "Harlestrand", grounded at East Lane where we believe the Breeches Buoy was used for the last time in Gale 8 winds and heavy snow.

Roy was made Deputy Station Officer in recent years and was concerned to hear that the Station at Shingle Street was to be sold off by the Government. Roy was a stalwart in campaigning to keep it open. However, after five years the Station finally closed. Not giving up Roy showed much enthusiasm in getting the new site up and running and maintaining the traditional Shingle Street team spirit. There is always smiles and laughter when Roy is about.

Congratulations to Roy on recently being awarded a long service medal in recognition of his 40 years' service to HM Coastguard.
