PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Sale of Bawdsey Manor: You will all probably be aware by now of the closure of Alexanders College and the sale of Bawdsey Estate. This will affect the area in a number of ways and not least the programme for BQVC. The Parish Council is urgently looking into this in association with the District Council and will update parishioners on any new developments.

Emergency Plan: Bawdsey and Alderton have now registered its joint Emergency Plan with the Joint Emergency Planning Unit at SCDC. Any new resident who has not received an Emergency leaflet can contact the clerk or download it from the website <http://www.bawdsey.onesuffolk.net>. A letter will shortly be sent to all residents asking what particular skills they can offer in the case of an emergency.

Note New number to report a power cut or any problems with electricity is 105.

Footpath diversion: Suffolk County Council has made an order closing the footpath approximately 430 metres north of East Lane to facilitate remedial works to the access track and the footpath surface along the top of the embankment.
