PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Mary Warner Educational Foundation This charity is empowered to make grants to students under the age of 25 who live in the area and who may be in need of financial assistance. The monies must be used for promoting education and can include awarding bursaries to eligible students, maintenance allowances or grants tenable at any school or further education institute as well as for uniforms, clothing, tools, instruments or books to assist persons to pursue their education, a trade or service. The Trustees are looking to make a fresh set of grants at their next meeting in late September. They advise applying after exam results are known and, if applicable, once a college place has been confirmed.

SID anti-speeding device: SCC Highways has approved four sites in the village where an SID device could safely be positioned and they will be installing posts in the next few weeks. PGL has given a generous donation towards the purchase of the SID and grants from SCDC and SCC have also been sought.

Camping on Bawdsey Beach: The Clerk has learned that it is illegal to camp on an SSSI: a site of Special Scientific Interest. The Deben Estuary is such an SSSI. Anyone camping on Bawdsey Beach can therefore be reported to Natural England. Overnight camping at East Lane is also illegal as it is in private ownership. The Deben Peninsula has a wealth of campsites in attractive surroundings which could be pointed out to campervan owners.

BAWDSEY WELCOMES THE RAF100 BATON RELAY TEAM

On 1 April this year, one hundred years since the formation of the Royal Air Force, a specially designed baton set off on a journey around the UK and abroad. At 2.00pm precisely on the 24 June, Callum (running) and Gemma (on a bike) who had left Woodbridge earlier that afternoon, arrived at the Bawdsey Radar Transmitter Block to a rousing reception from a welcoming party of RAF personnel, cadets, veterans and other associations plus members of the public keen to show their support for the men and women of the RAF.

Group Captain Robert Woods, Station Commander RAF High Wycombe, who had the original idea for the Baton relay, gave a speech to formally welcome and congratulate the team on their achievements. It was especially poignant for the Group Captain, as his father Peter, who had been stationed at Bawdsey, and his son James were there as well to join in the celebrations. After the ceremony, Peter shared many stories and fond memories of his Bawdsey days.

The brand new radar exhibition in the Transmitter Block was open to everyone for the day and with some welcome drinks and excellent cakes laid on by the Bawdsey volunteers, a total of over £160 was collected for the RAF100 Appeal. This was a very special day for all involved and it was a fantastic recognition of the part that Bawdsey has played in the RAF story that started 100 years ago.

NEW COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT OFFICERS

Suffolk Constabulary's nine new Community Engagement Officers (CEO) are now in post and will be working hard to ensure they engage with communities, individuals and partners in their area.

These dedicated officers will work closely with the Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNTs) to build engagement opportunities to keep communities better informed of what the force is doing, identify crime trends in their area and be responsible for organising some particular public meetings.

The CEOs will use a variety of engagement tools that will include face to face meetings and surgeries, but will also make increasing use of digital and social media. By using all of these methods they will ensure that relevant information is provided in a timely way.

Each CEO will be using a dedicated Facebook account for their locality to ensure residents are aware of, and can take part in, events, campaigns, initiatives and meetings. They will also be looking at how they can support and develop volunteer schemes in their areas such as Community Speedwatch and Neighbourhood Watch.

The CEO is a uniformed operational role, operating from the nine existing locality bases with the officers' working day and evening shifts. The nine Community Engagement Officers are:
