BAWDSEY SCHOOL NEWS

At Bawdsey school anyone is invited to come and have a **free NHS Health check** with thanks to One Life Suffolk. On the 3rd, 11th and 18th of December from 9.30am-4.00pm we are hosting a private room, with a private entry, away from the main school building for anyone who is between 40-74 years old. It will include a blood pressure and cholesterol check to assess your general health and any risks of diseases such as stroke, diabetes and heart disease. Eligibility is for anyone who has not had an NHS health check in the last 5 years and with no current diagnosis of heart disease, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, stroke, kidney disease or vascular dementia. The pupils from years 2-6 would also like to invite everyone to their Panto performances of 'Panto Pandemonium' on Tuesday 11 and Wednesday 12 December from 6.00pm - we hope to see you there. There are no costs involved. You are also welcome to attend our Christmas Fayre on Friday 14 December at 2.30pm and our regular OAP lunch still takes place on the second Thursday of the month (see diary page for dates).

We also have a new Baby and Toddler group on a Tuesday morning which everyone is welcome to attend in the school hall. Fun for the children, a cuppa and a chance to chat for the adults from 9.00am-11.00am. Our longer running Baby and Toddler session on a Friday afternoon is now a stay and play afternoon in the EYFS setting. Again fun for the children, a cuppa and a chance to chat for the adults. There are no costs and everyone is welcome.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next PC meeting will be held on Wednesday 23 January at 7.00pm. All welcome. A draft budget was approved at November's PC meeting and the precept will be confirmed in January.

Highways matters: The broken-up nature of much of the stretch of pavement from 11 The Street to the Village Hall has been reported to Highways. It is hoped this can be repaired by means of a system of slurry sealing which can repair the surface of the pavement, making it more even and thus safer to pedestrians. The PC has also asked Highways to renew faded 30mph repeater signs, to paint 30mph roundels outside the church and along Ferry Road and to give an additional leg to our Bawdsey sign.

Planning: The Parish Council has approved the installation of a 24 metre lattice tower to improve internet connectivity in the surrounding area on high land on the Bawdsey Manor Estate- see Reference DC/18/4196/FUL.

News from Scottish Power: All EA1 drill activity at the Landfall site is complete. The final activities associated with the landfall drill are the extension of one EA3 drill to the awaiting offshore reception pit, (already underway) - followed by a duct pull in and calibration. Duct pull in and calibration is very much dependent on weather as it involves off shore support vessels. Volker have commissioned a larger Jack Up Barge that has more capacity to deal with sea conditions and it is hoped that this barge will enable operations to be completed in December 2018. Volker are also in the process of constructing the second EA1 Transition Joint Bay at the moment, which is planned to be finished by early December. Once operations are completed there will be some time required to demobilise and remove materials from site. Full reinstatement across the project (removal of construction compounds, haul road removal, landscaping and so on) will take place in 2019. An update will be forthcoming regarding the timing of these Works. A worker who suffered a cardiac arrest last month on the site is recovering in hospital. Bawdsey Radar Trust: Congratulations to Bawdsey Radar which was awarded first place in SCDC's Quality of Place Awards in the Conservation category for the fantastic conservation of the Transmitter Block and its transformation into a first class museum. The Block will be open on Thursday 6 December from 11.00am-3.00pm (see Radar notes). The gift shop has great Christmas present ideas too.

News from East Suffolk Council: On 1 April 2019 a new 'super district' authority will be formed, serving the residents, businesses and communities of both Suffolk Coastal and Waveney. The new district will be served by 55 councillors, each representing a 'ward' – the boundaries of which were recently published by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England. There are 29 separate wards in total and some wards will be larger than others, with eight of them represented by three councillors, ten represented by two councillors and finally eleven wards with one councillor each.

Stephen Baker, Chief Executive for Suffolk Coastal and Waveney District Councils said: "We are looking for people who are interested in the exciting challenge of becoming one of the first ever East Suffolk councillors. Our new councillors need to be passionate about local issues, energetic and committed to making a difference to the lives of local people.

"Councillors play an important role in making sure the voices of a community are heard and the needs of local people are met. There are no formal qualifications needed and we would encourage anyone meeting the eligibility criteria to consider standing for election; anyone elected for the first time will be given all the training and support they need."

REMOVAL OF UNWANTED BROWN BINS BEGINS

Phase one of delivering the new garden waste bins has been completed, although we will continue to deliver them to people who signed up after 26 August. The new bins have been fitted with embedded, hi-tech tags. These can be 'read' by a special device that the bin lorry crews have, to ensure the right bins are emptied. We will also be carrying out a phased 'retro-fit' of tags to brown bins, where people have joined the scheme but not opted to have one of the new larger green bins.

We have now started collecting all unwanted brown bins area by area, according to normal routes and days for collection. A week before the removal of the brown bins, our crews will leave a hanger on the grey bins. This explains what to do and when to present brown bins for us to take away. If your unwanted brown bin is not removed with others in your street, you can report it to us. We will try to remove any we've missed within a week, but bear with us as there is a lot to be done.

Households are being asked to put unwanted brown bins out on their normal garden waste collection day, and to re-use the bin hanger to tell the removal crews to take it away. Securely attach the hanger to the handle of the unwanted brown bin so that the 'tick' is clearly visible. If you don't have the hanger, you can put a note on any unwanted brown bin, asking for it to be taken away. Just make sure the note is large enough to be clearly visible to the crew and securely attached to the bin.

On collection day, the refuse crews will empty ALL brown bins as well as green bins. The unwanted brown bins will be marked with temporary spray paint and left by the side of the road. The removal crews will pick these up later on the same day and will only take the bins with the sprayed marking. If there is any doubt as to whether the bin is wanted or not, it will not be removed. We don't know how many households want to keep their brown bins for repurposing and how many will need to be removed. Therefore, it is hard to set a timescale, but we estimate that around 40,000 unwanted brown bins will be removed over a six week period.

It is never too late to join the Garden Waste Scheme and still get 12 months' worth of collections. It is quick and easy to sign up. You can:

- Go online at my.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/MyServices. You will need to register, or login to, your My Eastsuffolk account and complete the form for garden waste
- Call Customer Services on 01394 383 789, and choose option '0'
- Or visit our Customer Service staff in Felixstowe and Woodbridge Library

You will need a debit or credit card to pay. The fee for each bin is £43 for a year (the equivalent of £1.65 per fortnightly collection). You can place your order now and don't forget to say 'YES' to the upgrade.

If you are already a member of the scheme and haven't opted in yet, you can still change your mind. We will continue to provide the upgrade bins, free of charge, to anyone who is eligible, even after the autumn rollout.

Worried about the lid not fitting on new green bin? You may find that the lid of your new green bin does not seem to fit properly. Some warping can occur because of the way the bins have been stacked for transportation. This is normal and we know that the warping does rectify itself within about a month and the lid will fit correctly. We recommend you place a heavy item on the top of your bin lid for a few days to encourage it to go back to the correct shape. There is no need to contact us about this unless your bin has other physical signs of damage.
