PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

New Councillors: Following elections on 2 May, BPC welcomes Rob Johnson and Clare Walker on to the council. Rob is replacing Rawdon Saunders as VHRGC rep and will also coordinate the Emergency Committee.

May AGM: The minutes for this meeting have now been published and can be read on the village notice board and on the website. The end-of-year accounts have been approved and are on the website. Because our turnover for 2018-19 was under £25,000, the council is exempt from an external audit this year. The accounts will be available for viewing from 26 June - 6 August. Emergency Committee Volunteers: Volunteers for this committee are actively being sought so do please let Rob Johnson know if you would like to join the group. His email is rob@bawdseypc.co.uk. Bawdsey is linked together with Alderton and has an approved Emergency Plan in the case of floods, power outages and any unforeseen events which would trigger measures to safeguard the community.

Dog Fouling: Unfortunately instances of dog fouling in the village are on the increase. There are dog bins at East Lane car park, Red House Lane, East Lane, Bawdsey Quay and Shingle Street all of which are emptied regularly. The Clerk has been asked to purchase another one for The Street so there is no excuse not to clear up after your dog!

Ideas for Community Benefit: At the Annual Parish Meeting, a parishioner asked the Scottish Power representative whether there was any possibility of the village receiving a Community Benefit donation, given the impact that this major engineering works has had on the village. 52 North - Charity Walk: If you walked through a random cross-section of Britain in 2019, what would you find? HELLO FROM BAWDSEY MARKET PRODUCERS

Our market at the Village Hall is held once a month (15 June/20 July/17 Aug/21 Sept/19 Oct/14 Dec). We'd like to update you on what we have on offer. Richard (put Hollesley pork on your fork) has lamb chops, legs, shoulder and mince, pork joints, sausages and gammon. All raised in Hollesley from traditional breeds. Emma at Skylark Farm has her usual goat meat products and also her new soft cheese with chilli and honey, pepper and rosemary, and garlic and herb. She also has mature cheeses plus her new goat milk ice cream - try vanilla and dark choc chip or a hint of gin and tonic. Val and Wil have their fruity Racallia olive oil and Brenda her home-made breads not to mention scrummy cake.

If you'd prefer savouries Amanda has Italian or boys own pizza, sausage and vegetable rolls freshly cooked on the premises. Claire's 'Not Just Tarts' sells tarts from lemon and chocolate to sticky toffee pudding. Bess at Leaping Hare has a range of hedge row preserves and pickles.

We also offer crafts. Sue has hand embroidered cards and pictures. Cheryl's cards are local photographic scenes and Pete has fishy hand painted stone paperweights and magnets, cards and pictures. Lastly we have the community stall where anyone can sell their surplus plants and vegetables. We hope to offer a fish stall in the future and next market we hope to have Suma ecological environmentally friendly washing and washing up liquid to refill your own bottles. Give it a try.
