You can fill it in on-line if you prefer. A code can be found on the survey. Please be assured it is completely confidential and anonymous. The next PC meeting is on Thursday 21 March, 7.00pm in the Village Hall. An agenda will be posted at least three days before the meeting and will be on the website with other related documents. You can keep up to date with parish matters by reading the minutes of bi-monthly PC meetings on the notice board outside the village hall or on the website www.bawdsey.onesuffolk.net under Parish Council.

The Annual Parish Meeting, 7.00pm, Thursday 4 April: This consists of a review of 2018-2019 and plans for 2019-20 with an opportunity for parishioners to ask any questions about parish matters. The issue of a village sign will be revisited. We also hope a representative from Scottish Power will attend.

Local Elections: The Notice of Election will be published on 15 March. This marks the beginning of the nomination period when anyone wishing to become a parish councillor, including existing councillors, can deliver their nomination paper by hand to the Returning Officer of East Suffolk at the council offices in Melton Monday-Friday, 9.00am-5.00pm. The deadline is 4.00pm, Wednesday 3 April. If there are more candidates than seats, there will be a contested election (Bawdsey PC has eight councillors); if not, the persons that have been nominated will automatically take up the vacant seats. The nomination paper requires the name and signature of two electors from the parish area. Clerk has the latest electoral roll and can supply electoral roll numbers. Clerk will have nomination papers and can deliver all of them to council offices if required. THE SHORELINE MANAGEMENT PLAN: REVIEWING OUR COASTLINE A letter from Andrew Block, Chairman of Bawdsey Parish Council

Dear Bawdsey Residents,

As you may know, a review is being carried out on our section of coast, including the stretch from Shingle Street to the mouth of the Deben, by Jacobs UK, a specialist firm appointed for this task. **The 'Hold the Line' designation** in the Current Management Plan for East Lane point has meant that each time there is a breach or damage there, it has proved possible for repair work to be carried out by the Environment Agency by the use of rock armour.

The outcome of reviews carried out elsewhere on the Suffolk coast (Slaughden, Kessingland,) suggests that such designations <u>may</u> be changed. So we <u>may</u> find our coastline being managed differently in the future, to deal with the problems of erosion and possible flooding.

At a meeting before Christmas with the Jacobs consultants, Suffolk Coastal and the Environment Agency, Parish Councillors and others were asked what their hopes and concerns for this coast were. It was suggested we look at what had been agreed previously when our coast was reviewed (see below) to see if we needed to change or add to the list.

I am sure there will come a point where a public meeting on this issue will be appropriate and helpful; in the meantime I would be really grateful if you could look through the list below from the 2010 review and let the Parish Council know, via Councillors or the Clerk, whether you think it is sufficiently clear and relevant, or whether you think changes are needed.
