During the year, members of Craft Group have made panels commemorating the end of World War I and these have now been machined together. This large mural will be on display at the Suffolk Punch Trust from 4-10 November (closed Tuesday), 10.30am-4.30pm. Refreshments are available. SWIFT COMMUNITY ACTION - STARTING A LOCAL SWIFT GROUP

Woodbridge Swifts, working with Save Our Suffolk (SOS) Swifts, has been collecting information about swift nests in our area since 2015. We now know the sites of around 100 nests in 20 towns/villages and have sold over 100 nest boxes. A number of local towns and villages, where there are nesting swifts, are starting Local Community Swift Groups. This is an exciting step towards halting the drastic decline in numbers. It means friends and interest groups can use local knowledge to spread information through the community. Some groups have arranged swift walks to identify and record swift nest sites. Others have had talks from SOS Swifts expert, visited local schools and have put up nest boxes on houses, village buildings and their Parish Church. There are swift groups in Woodbridge, Aldeburgh, Orford, Wickham Market, Saxmundham, Shottisham and Waldringfield. We would like more groups in Hollesley, Alderton, Bawdsev, Grundisburgh, Hasketon, the Bealings and Framlingham. Our aim is to have a swift group in every town/village where there are swifts, to monitor and record the population, building on numbers by preserving nests and creating nesting places by putting up nest boxes. If we could slow or halt the declining numbers, we will have made a small contribution to the conservation of wildlife for the next generation.

We are looking for more people to get involved with saving swifts in all these towns and villages. To support these local groups and individuals, *SOS Swifts* will offer 'Swift Adviser' training mornings, on Saturdays between autumn 2018-spring 2019. The free training is for anyone who wants to know more about the lives of Swifts, the reasons for their decline and how we can all help them. We also hope to hold a specialist event on How to Rehabilitate Grounded and Injured Swifts. This will be for those able to give a lot of time to care for Swifts between June-September and be on call if the need arises. Existing Community Swift groups:
