BAWDSEY RADAR TRUST

Hard to believe but October is here and Sunday 28 October will be the last day of the official season at the Transmitter Block. If you've visited during this first season, thank you and if you haven't we hope to see you next year!

It's been a super first season – the Transmitter Block is now off Historic England's At Risk register, the Duke of Gloucester formally opened the new museum in July and we've welcomed thousands of visitors who have appreciated the Bawdsey story as well as bringing important tourism benefits to this special part of Suffolk.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

East Lane Sea Wall Footpath: The Parish Council has reported the broken-up nature of the sea wall path to SCC Rights of Way Officer. SUFFOLK COASTAL NEW LARGER GARDEN WASTE BINS

Delivery of the new, larger garden waste bins will start shortly. The paid-for garden waste collections commenced in May. Subscribers can upgrade to a free larger (240 litre) green bin (the current brown bins are 140 litres). The new bins have embedded, hi tech tags which can be read by a special device in the bin lorries, to ensure the right bins are emptied. About 33,500 households (about 57% of homes) signed up for the paid-for service. Of these, 80% opted for the larger green bins, so delivering the new bins is a huge logistical exercise. The Council will return at a later date to pick up unwanted old brown bins, although people are welcome to keep them. The main delivery of the new larger green bins will start on 2 October and will take about a month to deliver to all those who opted in. The bins will also have an address/bar code sticker fixed to them. This sticker is temporary and will eventually come off - its purpose is purely to aid delivery.

In future, crews will identify subscribed bins by using a special device to read the embedded ID tag. In the event that a subscriber's bin is lost or stolen, we are able to de-register the bin to take it out of service. This means there is no incentive to take someone else's bin. It also means the tags prove conclusively that people have paid for the service and links their bin to their property. A team will return about a month later to empty and pick up unwanted brown bins (more information nearer the time). If you are already a member of the scheme and haven't opted in yet, you still can. We will continue to provide the free upgrade bins to anyone who is eligible. Anyone wanting to opt in should contact customer services.

It's not too late to join the Scheme and still get 12 months worth of collections. Go online at my.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/MyServices, call Customer Services 01394 383789, and choose option '0', or visit Customer Services in Felixstowe and Woodbridge Libraries. The fee for each bin is £43 for a year. We will also carry out a phased retro-fit of security tags to brown bins, where people joined the scheme but did not opt to have a new larger bin. This is likely to happen towards the end of the year.

If you have not joined the Scheme, or if you have opted for a new green bin, and want to keep your old brown bin - you can. If you have an unwanted brown bin instructions will be left on your grey-lidded bin shortly telling you when to put your old brown bin out for us to take away.
