RECREATION GROUND

We have just finished a refurbishment of the play equipment area. A leg of the zip wire ride had to be re-cemented into the ground and we had to cement the path to the tennis court which was collapsing and becoming dangerous. The play equipment has been rubbed down and repainted, and due to consistent vandalism to the fence we have now, with considerable help from the Offenders Community Payback Team, had it all strengthened and painted. We hope to cut back greenery along the south side in the Autumn to allow light to get in to dry out the play surface which gets slippery when wet.

We have had reports of loud, bad language being used on the play area and tennis courts and we have put up signs to say that bad language or behaviour will not be tolerated.

The Saxon senior football club has started playing on the field and have put in lights in all the rooms in the pavilion, and are going to put in a disabled loo as well as starting to repaint the interior. The Football Club is also erecting a large shed, which they have obtained, next door to the cricket nets to take the tents and fete equipment which will make it easier to transport them onto the field rather than the shed in the far tennis court corner. We are pleased that the Recreation Ground is looking so much better and that it is now being used more.

OPEN HOUSE AT BEACH HOUSE, SHINGLE STREET

Beach House at Shingle Street will be open for visits, teas and cakes on Saturday 9 September 2017. The house is of significant architectural interest. It was designed and built by John Penn, 1921-2007 as one of nine small modernist houses he built in east Suffolk during the 1960s, an exhibition of which was compiled and shown in her London gallery by Margaret Howell, fashion designer, of Bawdsey. The houses still appear uncompromisingly modern, although now well over 40 years old. Penn was also an accomplished painter and furniture designer. Brought up at Bawdsey Hall, he served in the Grenadier Guards and won the Military Cross. He then qualified in architecture, partly studying in California with Neutra.

Beach House will be open from 11.00am-5.00pm, with a £5 entrance fee. For a further £5, the exhibition compiled by Margaret Howell, will be available to view with the chance to talk to Margaret, and to hear from Tony Chambers, the editor of 'Wallpaper', the design magazine, who owns a Penn house in Rendham.
